Guidelines for Final Submission and Registration of Late-breaking Results

(updated on 25 August 2025)

- 1. Acceptance notifications are expected to be sent out on August 30th. Those who receive an acceptance notification should register no later than 10 September. Please note that the early bird discount will expire on 03 September. Registration between 04 September and 10 September is possible, but without the early bird discount.
- 2. Regarding registration, as with regular papers, a student can only register one late-breaking result submission. Non-students can register for two. The price is the same as for regular papers.
- 3. At the final submission stage, the PDF of US letter-sized abstract (whose revision is optional) needs to be uploaded to PaperPlaza. In addition, the PDF of its associated A0-sized poster (portrait orientation, without template restrictions) needs to be uploaded to PaperPlaza as an attachment. Participants must first complete the registration process outlined above. After registration is complete, the documents can be uploaded to PaperPlaza. The deadline is 10 September.

The above policies are subject to adjustments due to technical reasons.

FAQ

Q1: Should the authors print and bring the posters?

A1: Yes. Posters should be prepared and printed by the authors on A0-sized paper or fabric for display during the Poster Session.

Q2: I am a non-student and have previously registered for only one regular paper. I wish to additionally register a late-breaking result. How should I operate?

A2: You can modify your personal information in the registration system to include the second paper as a late-breaking result without additional payment.

Q3: Should the one-page PDF of the extended abstract be uploaded at the final submission stage?

A3: Yes. The one-page PDF of the extended abstract needs to be re-uploaded even if

this PDF is identical to the initially submitted PDF.

Q4: What is the difference between the extended abstract and poster at the final submission stage?

A4: The main difference lies in the size. The size of the extended abstract is US Letter, while the size of the poster is A0. In terms of content, they can either be the same or have different presentation styles (the technical contributions should be consistent).
